The Bharat Scouts & Guides is a voluntary educational movement for young people without distinction of origin, race or creed. The purpose of the movement is to develop the character of the youth and selfless service to the country to become responsible citizen.

The Scouts & Guides movement is one of the largest Uniformed International Youth Organization having 64 million members in more than 161 countries. It is affiliated to World Organisation of Scout Movement (WOSM) and World Associations of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS). And, on the basis of its numerical strength, The Bharat Scouts & Guides stand fourth in Scout Wing and First in Guide Wing at the World Level.

Scouting & Guiding in India mirrors firm determination, commitment to ideals, dedicated service to the Nation and World brotherhood. Scouting/Guiding is a non-formal educational movement with training methods based on Law that Promise and suited to various age groups. It makes the Scouts & Guides resourceful, self-reliant and ever helpful towards others, helps to discover their latent faculties and talents, as well as encourages them to express the same creativity.

The qualities inculcating through training are ability to adopt and acquire sense of responsibilities, leadership, development skills and management techniques. Training to the entrants is given through discussions, skill demonstration in camps and participation in various Community Development Programmes. Camps are organised at various levels like Rallies, National Integration Camps, Jamborees, Symposium, Youth Forums, Discussions, Skill Development Training, Disaster Preparedness and Management Techniques etc.



## PREAMBLE

Scouting / Guiding is a voluntary movement for young people aged 5 to 25 years old with various groups that is open to all regardless of origin, race, or creed, and supported by adults to assist the young people and their programme of informal education with an emphasis on practical outdoor activities (Camping, Hiking, Trekking, Backwoodsman, Aquatics, Sports, Culture, and Heritage) that provides a life skill experience for a young boy or girl to lead a life with bravery.

The entire Scouting / Guiding programme is developed using the Scout Method to train a boy / girl based on their age groups in order to develop them through the goals of scouting, which include character development, citizenship training, leadership, individual life skills, and personal fitness. They also have the opportunity to meet new people and learn new skills.

The Scout / Guide Promise and Law, which includes a 5-dimensional approach of Physical, Intellectual, Emotional, Social, and Spiritual, explain a simple code of living to which all Scouts / Guides make a personal commitment.

The Proficiency Skills that boys and girls can choose based on their areas of interest or hobbies as per their age group are value-based life skills.

## What are the benefits of Scouting/Guiding to the community?

Scouting / Guiding encourages young people to acquire a sense of belonging, curiosity about the world, tolerance for others and variety of practical life skills.

# As shown below, young people are divided into distinct age groups and sections.

## When a boy / girl joins scouting / guiding they will be able to

- For Scouts / Guides to receive Rajya Puraskar (from Governor) and Rashtrapati Award/Certificate (from President)
- > For Cubs / Bulbuls to receive Golden Arrow Award (National Level Award)
- Understand and work on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- Manage time
- Improve their self-esteem
- Be committed
- > Opportunity to have social network and friends globally, nationally and locally.
- Be a responsible global active citizen
- > Learning by doing in a fun way and adventure will help them release the stress
- Give more focus to their academic performance
- Inculcate Leadership qualities
- Smart, Humble and peace building
- Build a lifelong skill
- Have exposure to International / National and State level events participation
- Help them to build team spirit

If the Boys and Girls are given an opportunity to join Scouting / Guiding Movement along with the education as Co-Curricular activities, it will give an all-round benefit to them. Hence it can be recommended to all CBSE schools to have at least one unit of each section of Scouting / Guiding which can help institutions to support the young people development based on the National Educational Policy.

#### Grading:

Additional marks like other co-curricular activities can be graded based on the attendance and performance on all activities of Scouting and Guiding.

#### **Programmes:**

A complete manual giving in the Aims, Policy, Rules and Organisation for Scout Wing (APRO Part II) for Cubs, Scouts and Rovers program and Guide wing (APRO Part III) for Bunnies, Bulbuls, Guides and Rangers Program has been designed according to the needs. This will assist them in achieving the objectives of the program and assist in gaining self-progressive level of recognitions.

They can attend training, testing camps, Workshops on specialised initiatives, Jamborees which are organised by concern districts or State level or National level. They also get privilege to attend International Jamborees/ Events where they will be able to get more fun and adventures along with friends from more than 172 countries.

## Support:

BSG will provide technical support for training of Unit Leaders (teachers who will be leading the Unit) and Youth Activities.

## **District Association:**

All the political States of the India are recognised as State Association and the Revenue/ Educational Districts will be affiliated as the District Associations under the state association.

## **Groups and Units:**

Each school can be registered as one group for Scout Wing separately which consists of Cub Unit, Scout Unit and Rover Unit; similarly, one group for Guide Wing which consists of Bunnies Unit, Bulbul Unit, Guide Unit and Ranger Unit. Each unit should have one teacher who should be undergone training in the respective section of their unit to which he / she will be acting as Unit Leader.

Instructions:

- 1. Forms should be submitted separately for Scout/Guide Group.
- 2. To be made out in Quadruplicate and forwarded to the Secretary of the Local/District Association who will then get the forms signed by the Commissioners concerned and send them to the State Headquarters for approval and registration.
- 3. Registration Forms should be submitted along with the requisite Affiliation fee and individual registration fee.
- 4. The State Secretary after registration will issue charter as per APRO -I.



## THE BHARAT SCOUTS & GUIDES

HOW TO START A UNIT

There shall be a separate Group for Scouts and a separate Group for Guides. The Group may either be sponsored or open.

**Explanation:** A Sponsored group is a Group attached to an Institution recognized by the National Association or the State Association and any other Group is an Open Group.

The basic Organisation in the Scout and Guide Movement is a Scout Group and Guide Group respectively.

1. A Complete Group of Scouts Shall consist of three units, namely a Cub Pack, a Scout Troop and a Rover Crew and may consist of any one or more of the said section or of the same section.

2. A Complete Group of Guides shall consist of three units, namely a Bulbul Flock, a Guide Company and a Ranger Team and may consist of any one or more of the said section or of the same section.

3. Where a Group consists of more than one unit, a person other than the persons in charge of such units shall be appointed as Group Leader and on such appointment he/she shall be issued a warrant.

Provided, however, wherever and whenever necessary, the person in charge of one of the Units may be appointed as Group Leader.

## **Group Registration :**

A Group shall be registered with the State Association through the Local and District Association and on such registration; the State Association shall issue a Charter signed by the State Chief Commissioner and State Secretary and by virtue of such a charter the Group Organisation shall function as such.

The registration shall be renewed annually.

The Group shall pay such registration fee as may be fixed by the State Executive Committee. Failure to pay the registration fee and Individual Registration Fee shall be entitled to cancellation of registration.
