

Director of Scouts (Prog. & Trg.) was nominated by the Hon'ble Chief National Commissioner to represent the Bharat Scouts and Guides in the 6th Asia Pacific Regional Messenger of Peace NSO Coordinators Meet held at Kathmandu, Nepal from 24th to 28th March, 2023. 15 (Fifteen) National Scout Associations (NSO) of WOSM participated viz. Bangladesh, Cambodia, Fiji, India, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand and Vietnam.

The Meet was officially inaugurated on 24th March, 2023 by Hon'ble Speaker of the Parliament of Nepal Shri Dev Raj Ghimere who was also the Chief Guest. Mr. J.

R.C. Panglinan, Regional Director, WSB/APR and officials of NSO Nepal were present. The aim of the Meet was to gather MoP and NSO Coordinators to share the information and experience on MoP Initiative and help the individuals to acquire knowledge and skills in the promotion of MoP 2.0 Network and Project Management towards effective implementation of the initiative.

During the Meet, development and success stories on the MoP Initiative (Network & Fund) that took place during the previous years were shared by all participating NSOs. Objectives like World Initiatives- Four Thematic areas of Education (Better World Framework), SDG Hub, Story Telling, Project Management Cycle, World Scouting Grant Management System, Strengthening knowledge and skills and MoP Network & project Management; Identifying scope in further strengthening Scouting and communities through projects & Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), role of NSO MoP Coordinators and expectations, preparation of NSO action plan on MoP Initiatives, Building local teams and network, Brand protections etc. were broadly discussed. 

WAGGGS AND BSG HAVE SIGNED AN 'AGREED ACTION DOCUMENT' FOR THE NEW PROJECT YOUTH-LED ACTION ON CLIMATE CHANGE

Youth-Led Action on Climate Change is a WAGGGS' programme known as Girl-Led Action on Climate Change that currently runs in Sub-Saharan Africa and Latin America, with the curriculum adapted for the specific issues faced in each of these regions and providing a variety of activities for girls and young women to



choose from based on their own lives and concerns. BSG has already been working on Climate Actions across the nation but this project will drive all the community actions in one direction to create a bigger and better impact.

A three days meeting from 18th -20th April 2023 was conducted at the Bharat Scouts and Guides, National Headquarters, New Delhi India to draft an implementation plan and project roll out action of Youth-Led Action on Climate Change project. Dr. K.K. Khandelwal, Chief National Commissioner, BSG has shown a keen interest and agreement for this project looking into the immediate need of action for climate change. Mr. Paul Bigmore, Head of Global Programmes, WAGGGS, Ms. Pascaline, Global Programmes Manager, YLACC, WAGGGS, Ms. Darshana Pawaskar, Joint Director of Guides, BSG NHQ, Mr. Arup Sarkar, Deputy Director of Scouts, BSG, NHQ and Ms. Himanshi Tomar, Project Manager BSG, NHQ were part of these discussions. An online meeting with all the State Chief Commissioner and their representatives was organised on 20th April 2023 to share the project plan of YLACC. The meeting was closed by signing off the 'Agreed Actions between WAGGGS and BSG' for this project.


INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY





Q1. I am a Unit Leader/Scout/Guide/Rover/Ranger, Can I register my Self?

Ans: If you are a Trained Unit Leader, ask your district/Local Association to register your Group and if Your Group is already registered, ask your Group Admin to Register you.

Q2. I'm a District Training Commissioner, how do I get registered or get my UID?

Ans: State/District/LA/Group has option to add Other Member like Group Leader Scout/District Training Commissioner/State Chief Commissioner etc. on this portal.

Q3. What do I do if I forget my password?

Ans: If you register someone but password is not received through email then just go to Member Password Reset option and follow the step or If you forgot your password, just go to forget password option or ask your upper admin to reset password for you.

Q4. What all details do I need to register in OYMS?

Ans: You need name, fathers name, Date of Birth to register Individual member but for State/District/LA/Group/Unit Leader, unique Email id is mandatory.

Q5. I moved to a new State/District, what do I do?

Ans: Any member/Leader can be transferred from one unit to another unit of same section. Currently Transfer option is enabled only at State and District Admin.

Q6. How do I change my Mail Id?

Ans: - Email id can be changed but to change the Email Id, you have to contact your Regional Headquarters through your State OYMS Coordinator.

OUALITY OF SCOUTING

In scouting, we believe that the quality of training depends on the quality of trainers. In the same way, the quality of training also depends on the quality of trainees or the participants. After the pandemic, a number of training courses are being conducted in full swing for adult leaders at different levels through camps. For every adult leader course, residential modules have been prepared and sent to the participants well in advance before the date of the course. The National Training Centre sends these residential modules to the participants with the expectation that the trainees will go through them and get a clear understanding of the subject. However, the participants or the trainees are not able to display the expected quality.

Here are given a few hints or guidelines for the participants who attend training courses, particularly at National Training Centre. The guidelines will help the trainees to undergo the required training and derive the maximum benefit from it. The guidelines are divided into three phases, namely, before the course, during the course, and after the course.

Before the course, the trainees are expected to focus their attention on the following:

- Uniform... check whether their uniform is perfect as per A.P.R.O. including different badges like membership badge, appropriate rank badge etc. in terms of measurement and other specifications. There are many vendors who supply unauthorised material. Be aware of them.
- Ensure completion of the pre-course assignment and study Self Learning Modules. Ensure that the participants should be ready to take a test on SLM on arrival at NTC.
- Proper authenticity letter from State Headquarters.
- ❖ Be in touch with the unit and should have working knowledge of running the unit.
- * Read at least the basic books.
- Better to carry scout literature like A.P.R.O. Part II/III, Scouting for Boys, and Wolf Cubs Hands book (if you are attending Cub Section Courses).
- ❖ A Knotting rope, a note book, a pen and a pencil etc.
- Some ideas with sketches with regard to various gadgets.
- Think of some new games and if necessary, take the necessary material required to play such games.
- Carry sketch pens etc for drawing sketches etc.



During the course, you may have to attend the following:

- Interact with the other trainees to share scouting skills and knowledge.
- Participate actively in group discussions, Brain storming, quiz etc.
- Never be a passive listener but an active participant.
- ❖ As the expert trainers deliver the session, make a note of the important points.
- Interact with the trainers after the session or when both of you are free, to share their experiences with you.
- If you are at NTC, Pachmarhi, use the Padolina library to read as many books as possible, particularly related to your section. The library had a rare collection of literature, some of which are out of print.
- * Remember if the participant is rich in the subject, then trainers would feel happy to deliver the subject taking your knowledge as a challenge.
- Conduct session as per session plan by preparing the session plan well.


AFTER THE COURSE,

- Implement your learning experiences as learning situations for your trainees in your unit.
- Spare a few hours for the growth of your unit at least 3 days a week.
- Respect other's views; be flexible.
- If you have not got a unit, at least now start the unit and work with the boys.
- If you do not run a unit, all the training that you receive at various levels will be a waste. It also results in the wastage of the trainer's time, your personal time and also the efforts of the organisers of the course.
- ❖ Be an active member of your local, district or state association in implementing the programmes.
- Commitment to the movement is more important than gaining course certificates.
- Keep contact with leaders and other participants of the course.

Goal No. 13: Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts


The global temperature has already risen 1.1°C above the pre-industrial level, with glaciers melting and the sea level rising. Impacts of climate



change also includes flooding and drought, displacing millions of people, sinking them into poverty and hunger, denying them access to basic services, such as health and education, vexpanding inequalities, stifling economic growth and even causing conflict. By 2030, an estimated 700 million people will be at risk of displacement by drought alone.

Taking urgent action to combat climate change and its devastating impacts is therefore an imperative to save lives and livelihood, and key to making the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its 17 Goals – the blueprint for a better future—a reality.

In 2020, concentrations of global greenhouse gases reached new highs, and realtime data point to continued

increases. As these concentrations rise, so does the Earth's temperature. In 2021, the global mean temperature was about 1.1°C above the pre-industrial level (from 1850 to 1900). The years from 2015 to 2021 were the seven warmest on record.

To limit warming to 1.5° Celsius above pre-industrial levels, as set out in the Paris Agreement, global greenhouse gas emissions will need to peak before 2025. Then they must decline by 43 per cent by 2030 and to net zero by 2050. Countries are articulating climate action plans to cut emissions and adapt to climate impacts through nationally determined contributions. However, current national commitments are not sufficient to meet the 1.5°C target.

Targets:

- 13.1 Strengthen resilience and adaptive capacity to climate-related hazards and natural disasters in all countries
- 13.2 Integrate climate change measures into national policies, strategies and planning
- 13.3 Improve education, awareness-raising and human and institutional capacity on climate change mitigation, adaptation, impact reduction and early warning
- 13. A Implement the commitment undertaken by developed-country parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change to a goal of mobilizing jointly \$100 billion annually by 2020 from all sources to address the needs of developing countries in the context of meaningful mitigation actions and transparency on implementation and fully operationalize the Green Climate Fund through its capitalization as soon as possible.
- 13.B Promote mechanisms for raising capacity for effective climate change-related planning and management in least developed countries and small island developing States, including focusing on women, youth and local and marginalized communities.
