he Bharat Scouts and Guides in India having over 6.3 million members are operational in all the states and union territories including Indian Railways and Pan India educational institutions.

The Bharat Scouts and Guides subscribing to the G20 Theme "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" or "One Earth  $\cdot$  One Family  $\cdot$  One Future", and furthering the "Mission Life" contributing to the vision of Bharat and the Prime Minister of India Sri Narendra Modi's commitment to sustainable development and climate action underscoring the importance of collective efforts (from the address of PM Modi in World Climate Summit Dec 2023), in collaboration with Ministry of External Affairs-BIMISTEC Division proposes "Youth-Led Action on Climate Change SEWOCON".

This conference will focus on the BIMSTEC Collaboration Sector "Environment and Climate Change" focusing on life themes as stated in Mission Life India led global mass movement.





#### **OBJECTIVES**

At the end of this Youth-Led Action on Climate Change SEWOCON, the participant will be able to -

- Identify the need for climate change
- Define climate change and the Greenhouse Effect
- Explain the effects of climate change
- Analyses its causes
- Explain the action taken by the United Nations as well as the Government of India.
- List out the activities for Youth/Scouts and guides for climate change
- To expose participants to the rich cultural heritage of India.

#### EXPECTED OUTCOME

- In-depth understanding of climate change: Participants will be able to identify the need for climate change action and explain the concept of climate change and the Greenhouse Effect.
- Recognition of climate change effects: Participants will gain insight into the various effects of climate change, including its impact on the environment, biodiversity, weather patterns, and human societies.
- Analytical skills to assess causes of climate change: Through discussions and workshops, participants will develop analytical skills to examine and analyze the causes of climate change, including the role of fossil fuels, deforestation, and industrial emissions.
- Knowledge of global and national climate action: Participants will learn about the initiatives and measures taken by the United Nations and the Government of India to address climate change.
- Youth empowerment for climate action: Participants will engage in interactive sessions that
  highlight the importance of youth-led action in combating climate change. They will be
  introduced to various activities and projects for youth, scouts, and guides that focus on
  environmental conservation and sustainability.
- Practical engagement and collaboration: The event will provide opportunities for participants to
  collaborate and share ideas on climate action projects they can lead or participate in within their
  communities.
- Inspiration for continued advocacy and action: Participants will leave the event inspired and
  motivated to continue their advocacy for climate action. They will have a clear roadmap for how
  they can contribute to climate change mitigation and adaptation in their daily lives and beyond.
- Cultural Exchange: To expose participants to the rich cultural heritage of India, thereby promoting mutual understanding and respect among participants from diverse backgrounds.

Overall, the expected outcome is for participants to emerge from the SEWOCON on Youth Led Action of Climate Change with a well-rounded understanding of the issue, the motivation to take action and the tools to make a positive impact in their communities and beyond.

#### SELECTION PROCEDURE

• Invitation to National Scouts Organizations and Member Organisation:

The Bharat Scouts and Guides will send official invitations to the National Scouts Organizations of the BIMSTEC countries. These organizations are requested to nominate senior Scouts and Guides, (known as Rovers and Rangers) along with two adults, one male and one female, preferably the Chief Commissioner or International Commissioner from National Scout Organisation or Member Organisation.

#### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The selected youth participants should be:

- Between the ages of 18 and 25.
- Preferably involved in Climate Change initiatives.

Based on the provided criteria, each National Scouts Organization/Member Organisation will nominate candidates for the event. These nominations will ensure a well-rounded and experienced group of participants.

#### TRAVELLING =

The Bharat Scouts and Guides will host the event and will take care of boarding and lodging during the event. The air fare shall be taken care by the participant or respective organisation.
